

"Jingle" as in Jingle Bell. A 12 year old palomino mare who joined the HfH heard in September 2020. She was a partial donation by the sellers and we received a \$2500 grant from Capital City Clauses to help with her purchase.

"Cello" is an 11 year old registered sorrel leopard appaloosa gelding. He joined our heard in October 2020. He was a former therapeutic and lesson horse.

"Chili" is an aged sorrel grade quarter horse gelding. He joined the herd in December 2020. He was a trail horse but may have had more extensive training in his earlier years.

"Bill" is a 15 yr old bay and white grade paint gelding. He was used as a kids trail ride horse. He joined the herd in December 2020.
